

Facing an irregular shaped quilt - Alison Schwabe



If you are making a LARGE piece, do these steps for each section of the facing, avoiding joins near the peaks/corners. Reinforce any large up-vertical or horizontal peaks before quilting, and complete quilting before facing with this method. Although there are heaps of other interesting ways to finish a studio art quilt, this method will satisfy all those looking for a neat 'properly finished' edge that will satisfy even the most picky Quilt Police!



- 2 Stitch layers together along seam allowance line
- 3 Clip any inward facing curves
- 4 Trim any excess facing fabric back to

5 About 1" - 2" in from seam line, cut out fabric to reveal front of quilt, and discard this

6 Turn facing to back of quilt, press edges

7 Where possible, stitch by hand or machine about 1/8" in from seam line, taking in both seam allowance and facing

8 Where the points' shaping don't allow hand or machine stitching, on the facing sew a little spiral of running stitches to gently gather and pull the facing down flat - now it will not roll forward to show.
